

II B.A Economics Students (18 Students) and a staff attended the Grama Sabha Meeting of Maravanmadam Village held at Antoniyaarpuram on 15.08.2024 at 11.00 a.m. In the meeting agenda several issues and village development programmes were discussed. Plans for many village development Programmes were also laid down. The core things discussed in the Grama Sabha Meeting are as follows:

1. The PM JANMAN Project has been launched to build concrete houses for tribal people on the brink of extinction. The houses to be build under this scheme should be 300 square feet houses at Rs. 5,07,000 in which Rs. 3,60,540 is the contribution of TN Govt.
2. Under the Prime Minister's Rural Housing Scheme, houses which have not been started/completed under the scheme should be identified and discussed with regards to remand and recovery if there is a valid reason for the same.

3. Under the Rural House Repair Scheme 2024-2025 the Village Panchayats should discuss ensuring that the beneficiaries selected for the rural house repair scheme and given administrative permission under the scheme start the work promptly.
4. Under farm and non -farm marketing 2024-2025 scheme, the village panchayat has to select beneficiaries for livelihood projects (farm and non-farm marketing) and pass a resolution in the Grama Sabha Meeting.
5. Self-Help group members who need small business loans are advised to apply and benefit under the MUDRA scheme (Micro Units Development and Reliance Agency)
6. National Program for preventing of Iodine deficiency deficiencies- To prevent non-iodized salt from being widely sold in rural areas for food and also to create awareness about the need for iodized salt by printing it in English as “This salt is for processing”
7. Online Tax payment service- Villagers can pay panchayat taxes and fees online through a website called [www. VPTAX.TNRD.TN.GOV.IN](http://www.VPTAX.TNRD.TN.GOV.IN)
8. Under Dr. Muthulakshmi Reddy Mternity fund scheme, poor pregnant mothers have to be compensated for loss of income during pregnancy and to provide adequate food during pregnancy etc.
9. Funding women-led enterprises by providing loans from 100 lakhs to 1000 lakhs.
10. Measures and precautionary measures should be taken in village panchayat for North -East monsoon rains.
11. Under Jal Jeevan Iyyakkam, people in the village should be advised to make safe and proper use of drinking water.
12. Precautions should be taken for contagious diseases.

The students also discussed about the CDP and UBA action plans with the village members in the Grama Sabha Meeting. Dr. Muthu Maha Laxmi, Assistant Professor and CDP/ UBA Department staff incharge escorted the students.



15.08.2024 – Area Cleaning

- Planting 500 trees along the 2 km stretch from Jakkammal Kovil to Fort.






01.03.2025 “Eyes Protection: A Step Towards Better Vision”








18.03.2025 – Installation of Sanitary napkin disposer
