Subavathy, Assistant Professor of Zoology, NSS Programme Officers and Youth Red Cross jointly organizes a 'Blood Donation Camp' on 07th October 2025 in collaboration with Thoothukudi Government Medical College Hospital, Thoothukudi. Rev. Sr. Dr. Jessie Fernando, Principal inaugurated the Blood Donation Camp. Dr. R. Shanthi, MBBS., DCP, Medical College Officer, Thoothukudi Government Medical College inculcated knowledge on the need for the donation of blood to students. She raised awareness about the importance of voluntary blood donation and foster community involvement. The camp witnessed overwhelming response and enthusiastic participation from students and faculty. The donors underwent screening including hemoglobin tests to ensure they are healthy and suitable for blood donation. Over 17.5 units of blood were collected under the

guidance of medical professionals from Thoothukudi Government Medical College Hospital. Nearly 25 students and staff members donated their blood. This camp served to provide access to blood without requiring donors to visit a hospital, educate the public on the importance of blood donation and are typically run by Government recognized blood banks with trained staff. Blood Donation cams ensure a consistent and adequate stock of safe blood for emergencies, surgeries and chronic illnesses.


