# Activities of the Economics Association








The PG Department of Economics, organizes its Guest Lecture on the topic Agriculture and Food Management in India on 28

#### **PTA** and Alumnae



PG Department of Economics students visited RNL millets industry on 31.08.2023, at Theni District. This visit was mainly focused on the product of millets .Mrs. SubhadraKamalakannan explained about the facilities available inside the industry, the methods of collecting raw materials and equipment used in the process .She also explained the maintenance of the equipment and ethics during the storage and disposal of millets. Students asked various queries and clarified their doubts.

On 14<sup>th</sup> October 20223, 11 students with 3 faculty went for a rural visit to Murappanad located in Thoothukudi district. Most of the people are dependent on agriculture and labour intensive. Agriculture is mainly rain fed due to non-availability of water for irrigation purpose. Most of the crops produced are consumed, only a small part of it sold in the local market. "Midday Meal Scheme" system also available in the rural area. The school going children got nutritional support, through the scheme.

Murappanad dam has proven to be significant sources of benefit for the local population. The dam likely plays a curial role in providing water for irrigation, facilitating agricultural activities, and contributing to overall water management in the region.
