The Chairperson Ms. X. Esther Vimala welcomed and introduced the Members. All the members were present for the meeting except the alumina.

Agenda Discussion:

The Chairperson presented the agenda and invited the members for discussion.

Agenda Item No.1

Syllabus for 2021-2022 Batch for II, III UG and II PG course structure for 2021-2024 and 2021-2023 respectively

- External Members of the Board highly appreciated the paperless or E - Presentation of the UG & PG Syllabi.
- The Board Members had thoroughly gone through the contents of all the courses for III, IV, V and VI Semesters of UG syllabus and III & IV Semesters of PG Syllabus and offered their Valuable Suggestions as follows:

UG Economics:

- As the Course Structure was finalised by the Board previous year the modifications and changes in the Titles of the courses were informed and got the approval of the Board.
- The self-study paper on Economics of Insurance in III Semester was replaced by Salesmanship and was accepted by the board members.
- The self-study paper on Tamilnadu Economy in V Semester was replaced by Self-employment with justification and was accepted by the board members
- The Board approved the change in the Title of the Course Core IX & Core XII – Monetary Economics I & II as Money & Banking I & II in Semesters V & VI
- The Board highly appreciated the syllabi of the new courses CSB – Tourism Economics I & II, NME- Economics for Competitive Examinations I & II in III and IV Semesters.

- The board suggested modifying the NME syllabus – Economics for Competitive Examinations with more importance to Indian Economy with special reference to union Budget and recent Economic Events in III Semester. In Semester IV in the topic Employment guarantee schemes, the board advised to mention some of the recent schemes.
- In Semester III, in Allied Course Mathematical Methods I, in Unit I, the board suggested to give the meaning of mathematical methods first.
- The board suggested that in CSB- Tourism Economics I, in Semester IV, the Medical tourism and its importance must be included.
- The board members appreciated the self-study paper on Salesmanship in III semester as it is a compulsory paper and the course was justified as it will give provisions for internship for Economics students as well as for MOOC course on the same topic.
- The board suggested to remove the topic Five Year Plans and recommended to include new gadgets in tourism, Modern Mobile Apps towards tourism such as GPS, APP, and CCTV etc., in CSB- Tourism Economics II in Semester IV
- The board appreciated the topics in the fifth unit of the CSB- Tourism Economics II course on important pilgrims and tourist centres.
- In the fourth semester, the NME- Economics for Competitive Examinations II, the board suggested to replace trade cycle and inflationary gap with the importance of budget, Decentralization of power and the three tier system of the government.
- The board recommended that in Semester V, Core VIII- Fiscal Economics I, must have an unit on centre and state relations and sources of revenue. Also the service tax topic must be replaced by GST.
- In Semester V, in Core IX Money and Banking I, the board recommended to include digital currency and factors affecting velocity of circulation of money. In Unit V, the topic of quantity theory of money Fishers and Cambridge need to be removed as it is a repetition.
- In Semester V, in Core X, International Economics the unit 2 topics Heckler version of comparative theory was removed as recommended by the board.
- In the case of Core XI Waste Management course, the board recommended to include the Legislative measures for waste management and State and central government policies for waste management. Unit III and unit V were modified with collection of waste and disposal mechanism of waste and the Board allowed to rearrange the units with some changes
- In Core XIII -Economic Growth and Development, the board recommended including topics on importance of Health, education, sanitation, etc; for Human Index Development.

- The Board appreciated all the Units of the new course Core XIV- Shipping Economics and the External Member & Industrialist acknowledged that this course will definitely provide employment opportunities for the Economics students in Shipping Companies.
- The Board appreciated the syllabus for Industrial Economics with Internship as an alternative course for Subject Project in Semester VI
- The board unanimously accepted the syllabus revision for all the courses and highly appreciated the new and thoughtful courses introduced in all the four semesters of II and III UG Economics.
- The percentage of syllabus revision for all the courses, the new courses introduced in II and III UG syllabus and the courses on employability, entrepreneurship and skill development are listed as follows :
