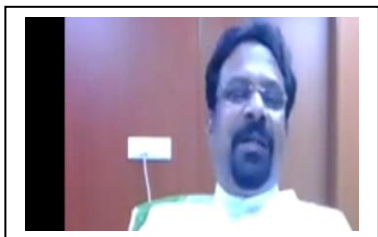


STUDENTS COUNCIL ACTIVITIES – 2021- 2022

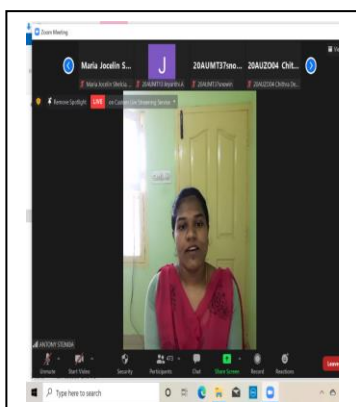

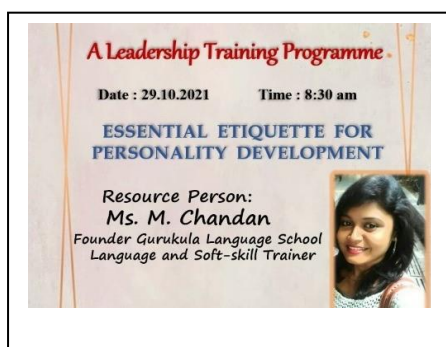

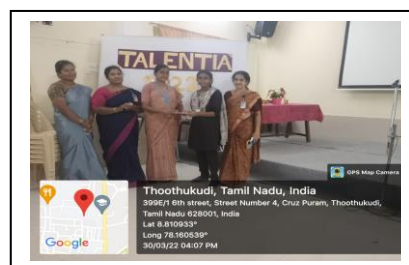
